Based on average score assessed by Scholarship Award Committee members (minimum of 4 scores per applicant), the applicant will be considered for a WMTA Summer Study scholarship if Aggregate score is \geq 13 (would need at least three “3’s” and two “2’s” to be considered as a strong application).

All applications will be considered, and the top aggregate score averages will be awarded from the annual pool of \$2,000.
